

4102 - BCC CONTROLLING INFECTIOUS OR CONTAGIOUS CONTAMINANTS POLICY

4102.1 Policy Statement:

It is the policy of the Barrie Curling Club (BCC) to operate a competent and functional curling facility and schedule to benefit its members. This shall be done in a manner that within all reasonable measures, offers any attendee of the facility including its members, staff, customers, contractors, suppliers, guest and such others as there may be, an acceptable environment that operates to inhibit sources of infection or contagion. Notwithstanding this policy and its derivative supporting procedures, control and inhibiting of infections and contagions relies on all attendees implementing their own personal protective and preventative measures in concert with the environment.

4102.2 Policy Direction:

The BCC shall be in full compliance with all Federal, Provincial and Municipal laws and regulations as may be extant from time to time.

The BCC shall implement, to the fullest extent possible, all advice and guidelines offered or presented by:

- The Simcoe Muskoka District Health Unit;
- Curling Canada;
- CurlON; and
- Such other authoritative and knowledgeable bodies as may be relevant.

The BCC shall undertake a thorough and continuous regime of cleaning, disinfection and sanitization to meet known infectious or contagious hazards. New procedures shall be developed as required to meet any new threats as identified by relevant authorities as identified above.

The BCC shall develop and communicate its rules of operation, procedures and the required conduct of any attendee in the facility by such manner as may be deemed effective, including, but not limited to:

- Policies and Procedures;
- Postings on its corporate web site;
- Signage throughout the facility;
- Emails and other communications with its membership;
- Instruction to and through league conveners; and
- Verbal communication.

The BCC shall encourage and engage its membership in ensuring the safety and well being of all attendees in the facility including, but not limited to:

- Compiling with the Harassment and Discrimination Policy;
- Executing relevant waivers and completing statements of compliance as become necessary through laws, regulations or duly recognized curling practices in Ontario;
- Contributing to the maintenance and disinfection of the facility;
- Taking individual responsibility for their own well being and that of others; and
- Self policing their own conduct and that of others.

The BCC requires that its staff, membership and guests refrain from attending at the facility in the event that they:

- Are experiencing health conditions or symptoms that are or may reasonably be construed as infectious or contagious;
- Have contracted COVID 19 and have yet to be declared clear by a responsible health body;
- Are experiencing symptoms related to COVID 19 or are experiencing such other symptoms as may be considered contagious;
- Have been exposed to an individual who has contracted COVID 19 and have not successfully completed the 14 day quarantine period symptom free; and/or
- Have travelled overseas and have not successfully completed the self isolation period of 14 days symptom free immediately following their return.

4102.3 Policy Accountability:

Policy Authority: It is the responsibility of the Director Health and Safety to maintain and monitor this Policy

Policy Application: It is the responsibility of the entire membership and staff of the BCC to apply and ensure the efficacy of the contents of this policy
